

During '07-'08, KATS, in collaboration with the Shawnee Mission East Share program (Students Helping in Areas Related to Education), held monthly birthday celebrations at 7 KCK and KCMO elementary schools. With the emphasis on early reading skills, 3rd graders at M.E. Pearson School received dictionaries, 4th graders enjoyed a trip to the Kansas State Capitol, and all students were presented with from 5-10 books for their personal libraries. ## EXPLAINING

## PLAN A: NCJW'S CAMPAIGN FOR CONTRACEPTIVE ACCESS



Plan A: NCJW's Campaign for Contraceptive Access educates and empowers individuals to advocate for women's universal access to contraceptive information and health services.

Through a combination of education and advocacy initiatives at the community, state, and national levels, Plan A aims to secure and protect access to contraceptive information and health services for all, putting individuals back in control of their personal health decisions.

In the United States, there is overwhelming popular support for comprehensive sexuality education and there is widespread use of contraceptives. However, an extreme religious minority is increasingly influencing policy and practices -- spreading misinformation, blocking women's access, and signaling that access to complete and accurate information and to safe and effective contraceptive options can no longer be taken for granted. Plan A is poised to help individuals and groups stand up and speak out.

June 7, 2008 marked the one year anniversary of the Plan A campaign. NCJW sections and Plan A advocates across the country have spent the past year engaging in this community-based grassroots campaign by:

- ⇒ Ensuring pharmacies in their area stock emergency contraception
- ⇒ Asking local school boards to require comprehensive sex ed programs
- ⇒ Advocating for affordable contraception on college campuses
- ⇒ And so much more.

#### **VOTING IN KANSAS MADE SIMPLE**

Don't wait in line to vote! Request an Application for Advance Voting Ballot (AAVB) for the August 5 Primary Election from the Johnson County Election Office at <a href="https://www.jocoelection.org">www.jocoelection.org</a> or by calling 913-782-3441. This form is also available from Johnson County city halls and libraries.

Only those who have declared a major party affiliation may vote in the primary. Change of party affiliation is an option on the Application. Democrats regain their unaffiliated status automatically. Republicans must re-register after the primary in order to regain their unaffiliated status.

Completed AAVBs must be received at the Election Office before 5:00 p.m. on August 1. Vote early and avoid the long lines.
