

Greetings!



The theme for October is National Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

Domestic violence touches the lives of Americans of all ages, leaving a devastating impact on women, men, and children of every background and circumstance. A family's home becomes a place of fear, hopelessness, and desperation when a woman is battered by her partner or a child witnesses the abuse of a loved one. Since the 1994 passage of the landmark Violence Against Women Act, our nation

has strengthened its response to this crime and increased services for victims. Still, far too many women and families in this country are affected by domestic violence. During National Domestic Violence Month, we recommit ourselves to ending violence within our homes, our communities, and our country.

We can't ignore the following statistics:

- ⇒ 85-95% of all domestic violence victims are female.
- ⇒ 5.3 million women are abused each year.
- ⇒ Domestic violence is the leading cause of injury to women.

In keeping with our yearly NCJW theme of I CAN HELP, here are steps you can share with a friend who may be in an abusive relationship:

- ⇒ call 911
- ⇒ take your children and go to a safe place.
- ⇒ go to the Emergency Room if injured.
- plan ahead: If possible, gather important legal/financial documents and medical records.
- ⇒ obtain a Protection from Abuse order
- ⇒ know that confidential help is available 24 hours a day.

NCJW Announces 2010 Flarsheim Fellowship Award

The Greater Kansas City Section of the National Council of Jewish Women is proud to announce the 2010 Flarsheim Fellowship was awarded to Lauren Tamar Graham.

Lauren is the daughter of Steve and Debbie Graham of Leawood. Currently, Lauren is attending the University of Colorado Denver, pursing a Masters in Counseling. She is a 2004 graduate of Hyman Brand Hebrew Academy. She graduated Magna Cum Laude from the University of Denver in 2008, majoring in Psychology with a minor in Judaic Studies. She is a member of Phi Beta Kappa and the Golden Key Honors Society. At DU, Lauren was part of the Honors Psychology Program and focused her research on autism. She was secretary of Hillel, active with Denver Chabad House, and taught at B'nai Chaim Synagogue, tutoring Bar Mitzvah students.

After graduation, Lauren moved to Chicago where she worked as a research assistant at the University of Chicago Psychology Department. She continued her Jewish activities at Rodfei Zedek synagogue, teaching four classes including Torah studies, Hebrew, Israeli culture and trope. She was promoted to Head Teacher. Her responsibilities included working directly with parents and planning curriculum.

Lauren feels these teaching and administrative experiences fostered her decision to be a school counselor. "I can combine my love for working in a school setting with my desire to help children with their emotional, social and behavioral issues. I also hope to advocate for educational equality and ensure that each and every student is given the opportunity, knowledge, self esteem and encouragement they will need to have successful futures."

The Flarsheim Fellowship is awarded to young Jewish Women entering their first year of graduate school. It is an honorarium based on academic excellence, community service and strength of character. 

To succeed in school, a child must be able to see the blackboard. Since school began in August, NCJW has provided 8 needy children with eye exams and eye glasses.

NCJW RECEIVES DELTA DENTAL GRANT



In July, NCJW received a Delta Dental of Kansas Foundation Grant of 2100 toothbrush kits enabling NCJW to provide toothbrush kits to 2100 children in Wyandotte County, KS. The KATS program will distribute 1,700 of these kits to children in four elementary schools (kindergarten through fifth grade). NCJW will provide an additional 400 toothbrush kits to Wyandotte County preschoolers enrolled in programs in schools in which 90 to 95 percent of students participate in the free lunch program.

This under-served population often has no annual dental exams and struggles to provide the absolute necessities of clothing and food. We hope the addition of the toothbrush kits will make a big im pact on their oral health. We thank grant writers **Ellen Portnoy** and **Connie Simon**.

SUPPORT SCIENCE OVER POLITICS: ACT NOW FOR STEM CELL RESEARCH



Illnesses such as diabetes, heart disease, and Parkinson's devastate the lives of far too many families. Embryonic stem cell research has the potential to revolutionize treatments for these conditions and save millions of lives.

In 2009, President Obama was able to lift onerous restrictions and allow stem cell research to move forward. However, last month a federal judge sided with religiously motivated plaintiffs and blocked further federal funding for this life-saving research. Now, Congress must make clear that neither politics nor religious ideology may jeopardize the responsible practice of sound science.
