Co-President's Message



We hope you were fortunate enough to watch NBC Nightly News on February 8 to see Tom Brokow's feature on NCJW's "Opening a New Window on Child Care."

Earlier that morning in the Mike Mansfield Room of the U.S. Capitol, NCJW launched the report on this hard-hitting, comprehensive look at the vital issue and continuing crisis of childcare.

In front of world wide press, NCJW National President, Jan Schneiderman, and National Vice President, Anne Oppenheimer, Chair of the Child Care Campaign Committee, spoke on NCJW's new report on the status of child care in the nation today.

Joining them to speak about the importance of this study were Senators Chris Dodd (CT) and Mary Landrieu (LA); Representatives Connie Morella (MD), Jan Schakowsky (IL) and Rosa DeLauro (CT); and representatives from Fannie Mae and the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Senator Chris Dodd said, "This report highlights the issue in clear and categorical language...If we knew of a disease that we could cure, but we sat on our hands and did nothing for 28 years, there would be outrage. And yet, sadly, that's what we as a nation have done when it comes to child care."

He was referring to the span of time that has occurred since NCJW's intital

landmark report "Windows on Day Care" published in 1972 which spoke about childcare as a critical issue for our nation. (Our Section was a major funder for the 1972 publication.)

The Greater Kansas City Section along with National and all other Sections take great pride in knowing that the vital issues related to child care is taking center stage! NCJW has begun to gather endorsements for a Statement of Principles on child care from 50 notable organizations to date including American Trial Lawyers Association, American Jewish Committee, Business and Professional Women USA, Child Care Action Campaign, Children's Defense Fund, National Education Association, National Organization for Women, Union of American Hebrew Congregations and the YWCA of USA.

Understanding Domestic Violence

By Susan Lebovitz

What are the warning signs of domestic violence? Unhealthy relationships can start with teenage dating, therefore, I will address "red flag relationships" as related to teenage dating, and also list warning signs in marital relationships.

Danger signals cover a wide area, and the abuser need not exhibit all the warning signs. If abuse occurs due to any of the methods listed below, then something has gone terribly wrong. Happening just once constitutes abuse; however, it can happen over a period of time. If total intimidation or isolation occurs, the victim becomes so dependent on the abuser that she really has no where to turn. Since domestic violence is extremely personal and embarrassing, the victim often decides not to share the initial stages of its occurrence, doesn't recognize it for what it is, or worse yet, denies its existence.

One additional "challenge" in the Jewish community remains the notion that "it doesn't happen here." Unfortunately, it does, and people who have studied this phenomena in Jewish communities feel strongly that the statistics parallel that of the gentile community.

In marital relationships, the behavior to watch for includes spouses who:

- ~ ignore what you say constantly,
- ~ ignore your personal space,
- ~ express anger or aggression for the opposite sex in general,
- ~ ignore needs of spouse,
- ~ attempt to make you feel guilty if you resist sexual advances,
- ~ act excessively jealous or possessive,
- ~ hold unrealistic ideas about the opposite sex,
- ~ drink or do drugs so that judgment is impaired,
- ~ see their actions as seductions, not rape,
- ~ resent the opposite sex if s/he is in a position of authority,
- ~ expect relationships to be on their terms.

When teens date, the signs for an unhealthy relationship may include several different characteristics. The abu-

sive teen may demonstrate abnormal dependency, excessive jealousy or possessiveness, denial of personal space, frequent bouts of anger, and have a bad relationship with parents. Victims feel angry, resentful, guilty, depressed, relief when the other person is not around, fear in ending the relationship, and manipulated.

As a caring, concerned Jewish community, it is each person's responsibility to be aware that this can happen to people we know, and to reach out to support and help these victims. Domestic violence knows no boundaries.
