
335 Attend 6th Annual Interfaith Luncheon

Three hundred thirty five people attended the sixth annual NCJW Interfaith Luncheon, Healing in a Fractured World through Spirituality. The luncheon was held at the Overland Park Marriott on February 26. The panelists included Shaheen Ahmed M.D., pathologist and treasurer of the Crescent Peace Society; Reverend Dr. Heather Entrekin, Senior Pastor, Prairie Baptist Church and Rabbi Jonathan Rudnick, Jewish Community Chaplain and Vice President of the Rabbinical Association of Greater Kansas City. NBC Action News Anchor Elizabeth Alex moderated the program.

The discussion covered such topics as peace in the Middle East, the importance of forgiveness and how individuals can make the world a better place. The dialogue pointed to more similarities than differences among the three religions. (cont. on p. 4)

Our Section participated in the third annual B'nai Tzedek Shuk at the Jewish Community Center on Thursday, February 26. The B'nai Zedek program introduces B'nai Mitzvot students to an active and thoughtful approach to tzedakah. The program enables students to set up their own philanthropic funds at the Jewish Community Foundation. In 2008, over \$16,000 in B'nai Zedek funds were granted to charitable organizations.

NCJW joined more than 20 other local Jewish charities offering information about their organizations to post Bar and Bat Mitzvah students.

Sandy Suffian highlighted our endeavors in high poverty elementary schools, our work on domestic violence awareness, and distributed NCJW brochures.
