## FOX FUND PROVIDES EXPERIENCE OF A LIFETIME FOR 6TH GRADERS

NCJW, through the **Thelma & Meyer Fox Children's Fund**, enabled 100 fifth graders at M. E. Pearson Elementary School, Kansas City, Kansas to see *Remembering The World of Anne Frank* at the Coterie. Here are some comments from some students and a teacher.

From a teacher: "The fifth grade students at M. E. Pearson would like to thank you for helping with funding for our field trip to the Coterie. Speaking for my class, several students left with tears and questions, along with a better understanding of the holocaust and the suffering of people based on their beliefs. After reading The Diary of Anne Frank, I chose not to share her death with the students. The shock of her death left students in awe with questions and anger. I chose not to edit the children's letters as they had tears in their eyes while writing."

From students letters: "Thank you for the money. I felt bad that they had to shave their head and take their shoes and glasses and did not have shoes on snowy days." "I did start to cry, but I did not want people to make fun of me." "I felt awfully sad about them strangling their puppies, giving them gas chamber, also cutting their hair off." "I really felt sorry for the Jewish people. It was horrible when Hitler killed the people. I was shocked and almost cried when I heard that Hitler killed his little people. When they separated the families I think that they felt really scared."

## SCHOLARSHIP REPORT

The Scholarship Committee was busy this year. A total of 19 scholarships were awarded to 9 new students, 8 returning students, and 2 graduate fellows.

These students attend Cleveland Chiropractic College, Kansas City, MO; Columbia University, New York City; Evangel University, Springfield MO; Fisk University in Nashville, TN; Emporia State University; University of Missouri, Kansas City; University of Missouri, Columbia; Kansas State; University of Kansas; and Johnson County Community College. The Flarsheim Fellowship recipients are attending Baltimore's Hebrew University and the University of Maryland and Ben-Gurion University of the Negev in Israel.

In order to keep up with the changing financial market, the amounts of the scholarships and the number of recipients are considered on a yearly basis. The Scholarship Committee is funded by generous endowments and yearly contributions from NCJW members and friends. This year's committee members included Ro Jacobson (chair), Jane Duggan, Deb Feingold, Bud Krasne, Sally Reicher, Sonia Singer and Ellen Portnoy.
