



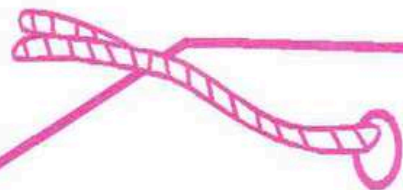

The Annual Meeting/Installation Luncheon on May 5, at the Junior Women's Symphony Alliance Designers Showhouse, was a fantastic start for the 1997-98 new term. I am honored to have been asked to serve as the NCJW, Greater Kansas City Section, President. I humbly accept this position and look forward to a year of service, growth, innovation and inspiration.

As many of you know, "NCJW is a volunteer organization, inspired by Jewish values, that works through a program of research, education, advocacy and community service to improve the quality of life for women, children and families and strives to ensure individual rights and freedom for all." This NCJW mission statement reflects the heart and soul of what this organization is all about. It also represents the reason for so many dedicated NCJW members.

The dedication and spirit of NCJW members was recently experienced by our board members Dierdre Baker, Carol Barnett, Merle Cole, Jackie Fleschman and myself while attending the NCJW Leadership Institute in Minneapolis the last week in May. At that meeting, a newly approved 3-year NCJW Executive Strategic Plan was introduced. The Strategic Plan includes 11 goals that envision a vibrant and effective Jewish women's organization in our communities and in our nation's capital. The Leaders' Institute provided us with many skill-building sessions in the areas of marketing, fundraising, communications, team-based leadership, creativity and change. Many of these sessions were presented by highly competent and well-educated NCJW members from all over the country. Other nationally recognized speakers talked about Women, Volunteerism and Leadership and the resurgence of respect for the volunteer in our country. A copy of the NCJW Strategic Plan Executive Summary is in our office for your review as well as other materials collected at the Institute. I hope

you will consider joining us for the Washington, D.C. Institute that will be held February 22-24, 1998.

Also in May, the Board, after reviewing a proposal presented by Ann Stern, voted to approve "The Silent Witness Exhibit" as a new community service project. This project will be co-sponsored with SAFEHOME, the Johnson County domestic shelter, and Kansas Coalition Against Sexual and Domestic Violence (KCSDV). The idea for "The Silent Witness Exhibit" began with a Minnesota women's artist group in 1992. They created 26 red silhouettes, representing women who died in the state as a result of domestic violence. Each silhouette has a plaque to memorialize a victim and tell her story. In many states, NCJW sections have spearheaded this project. The St. Louis NCJW section created the exhibit for Missouri. We will provide the funding, volunteers and passion for this project in Kansas. The national goal is for every state to have Silent Witnesses for display at the national rally on domestic violence in Washington, D.C. on October

18. Please call the NCJW office if you would like to support this project and receive information about the October event.

In order to fund "The Silent Witness Exhibit" and other section projects, we need your support. THRIFTIQUE, The Shopper's Dream, is a once-a-year major fund raising sale for the section. Volunteer for the Silent Witness Exhibit!

An incredibly needed action is being taken to speak out against domestic violence.

Our NCJW Section is sponsoring the Silent Witness Exhibit for the state of Kansas in cooperation with SAFE-HOME, the Johnson County domestic violence shelter, and KCSDV, the Kansas Coalition Against Sexual and Domestic Violence. Silhouettes representing women who died in the state in the past year as a result of domestic violence will be on exhibit throughout the state. Forty-eight (48) states have already developed Silent Witness Exhibits, many sponsored by NCJW Sections. The personal story of the deceased woman is on a plaque on the silhouette. Information

about services available for victims and survivors will be part of the exhibit. The important goals of this project are:

REMEMBERING - to honor the women who were murdered in acts of domestic violence;

AWARENESS - to raise the awareness in our communities of the extent of domestic violence;

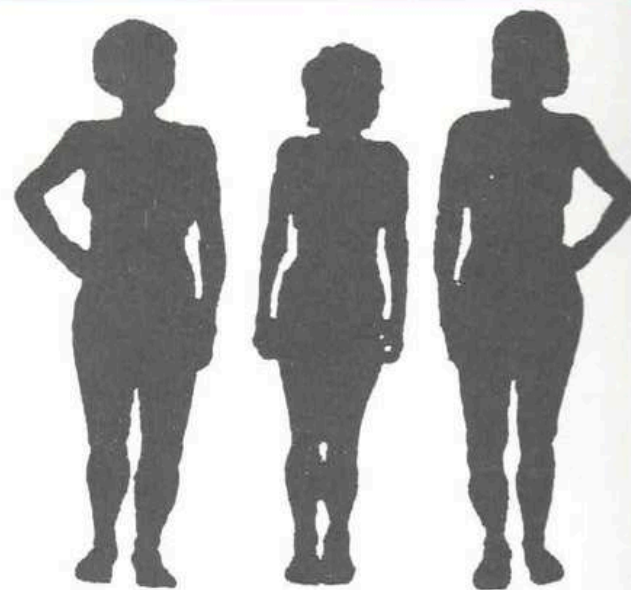
ADVOCACY - to help connect people with local resources for ending the violence in their lives;

LEGISLATION - to encourage community and legislative action to end the violence in our society.

The exhibits from each state will travel to Washington for an October 18 event. In

conjunction with live advocates, they will gather on the steps of the U.S. Capitol to make a silent, but poignant plea to our policy makers to enact changes in a system that has closed its eyes to the brutal circumstances existing in the lives of so many women.

Volunteers will be trained to accompany the exhibit and provide information. We will use our volunteers in the Johnson County and Wyandotte areas primarily. Other volunteers may want to serve on the planning committee or public relations committee. To

Sixth Graders Benefit From "Hello Israel"

The 11 and 12 year old children are listening, attentive and fascinated! No, they are not viewing the new "Lost World" movie release! They are students in the sixth grade learning about Israel, through an NCJW national program called "Hello, Israel." It is not cut and dried facts, but interesting cultural information about their peers in Israel. They participate in an "archaeological dig" and learn about the history of this far away land. Hands are going up, questions are asked, learning is going on in a fun and interesting presentation. Then to summarize everything they just learned, they watch a state-of-the-art, fast-paced movie reviewing Israel's culture, government, language, history and land!

Comments such as "Israeli students

go an extra day of school," or "boys and girls HAVE to go into the armed services after high school?" and "I thought Israel was a backward, non-modern country!" give the presenters of Hello Israel a true indication that their efforts are meaningful and worthwhile.

Students usually study different countries with textbooks, library materials and maps. Instead, Hello Israel is a highly effective multi-media presentation. With just a suitcase of visual aids and a script, you and another NCJW member are totally prepared to give this 45 minute or 1 1/2 hour lesson (depending on the school). You can pick the morning or afternoon that works into your schedule, and commit to as few as two presentations a school SEMESTER. That's it!

You don't need to be a seasoned speaker, just a good listener! This is not about religion and most of the presenters

have NOT even been to Israel. This is about teaching sixth graders about a country that is totally foreign to them. This is about erasing negative stereotypes and showing the cooperation between Israel and the world. Please be a part of this easy and rewarding program. You'll be hooked after your first presentation!
