Ruth Stern Lecture Hosts Dr. Joycelyn Elders

AIDS.
SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASES.
PRO-CHOICE.

For most, these topics are taboo. For M. Joycelyn Elders, M.D., these are the health care topics that need to be talked about and need to be taught. They're also the ones she'll talk candidly about when she comes to Kansas City to present the Greater Kansas City Section, National Council of Jewish Women's *Ruth Stern Lecture* being held at Beth Shalom Synagogue on Thursday, April 18 at 7:30 p.m.

Dr. Elders, a pediatric endocrinologist, was sworn in as the first African-American U.S. Surgeon General on September 8, 1993. During her Senate confirmation hearings, she stated: "I want to be a voice and vision of the poor and powerless. I want to change concern about social problems that affect health into

commitment. I would like to make every child born in America a wanted child."

Unfortunately, Dr. Elders didn't have a chance to make those dreams come true.

Because, just 15 months after her swearing in as Surgeon General, Dr. Elders was asked to resign because of her outspoken views.

Today, Dr. Elders divides her time between teaching future doctors in the classroom and in the clinic at the University of Arkansas Medical School.

Both Barbara and I wish you a happy, healthy New Year and we look forward to your being with us for all of these events!

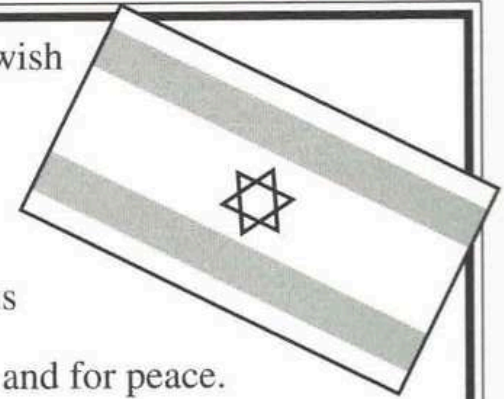

Child Care Information At Your Fingertips!

Where do home-based day care providers look up information like: Where do I take the children on a rainy day? Who do I contact for nutritional information? Where's the closest emergency room?

They turn to the *Family Child Care Provider Resource Handbook*. Published by the Greater Kansas City Section of NCJW, the 56 page handbook not only provides listings of important phone numbers, it also provides information about different agencies that can help a home-based child care provider.

Update — Kansas Voters!

There has been a new law passed in the 1995 legislature. You no longer need a reason to vote through the mail, or up to 20 days ahead of an election! Use the advance voting form attached for yourself and copy it for your family, neighbors, and friends. To receive more forms, call 782-3441, or go to your City Hall, library or high school. The election dates for 1996 are: Tuesday, April 2nd; Tuesday, August 6th; and Tuesday, November 5th.

In order to register to vote in these, or any election, use a Request for Registration form. If you wish to vote for a certain candidate in the April Presidential Election, make sure you are registered for the correct party of choice. If you are registered to a party different from your chosen Presidential candidate,

you must change your affiliation 14 days in advance of the election! Please call 782-3441 to find out how you are currently registered and that you are registered correctly! For further information, please contact Barbara Holzmark.

Requests for registration-by-mail packets made in writing should be mailed to the Johnson County Election Office, 2101 Kansas City Rd., Olathe, Kansas, 66061. For telephone requests, call 782-3441 and press five when you hear the recording. To save postage, you may register at any public library or city hall in Johnson County. Check with your local library for evening and weekend hours.

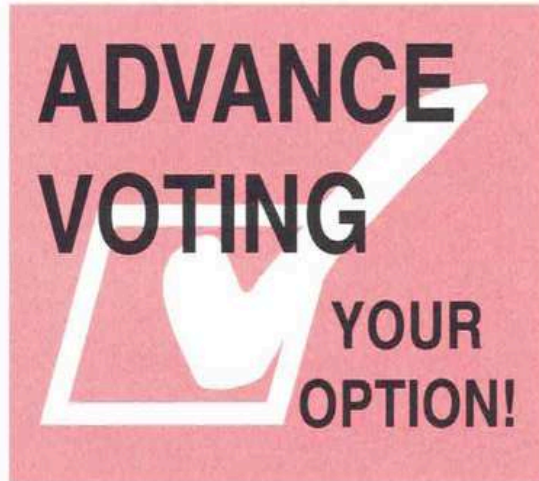

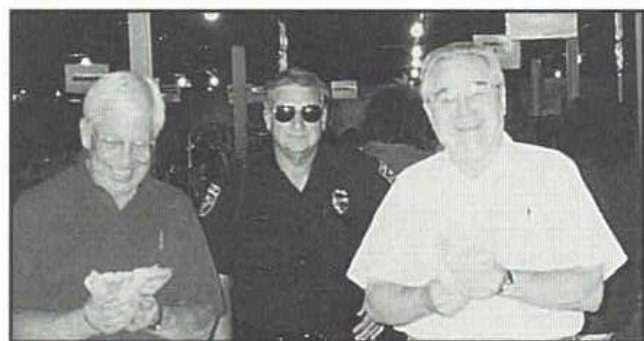
popular areas was the separate "boutique" offering furs, designer clothing, cocktail and formal wear.

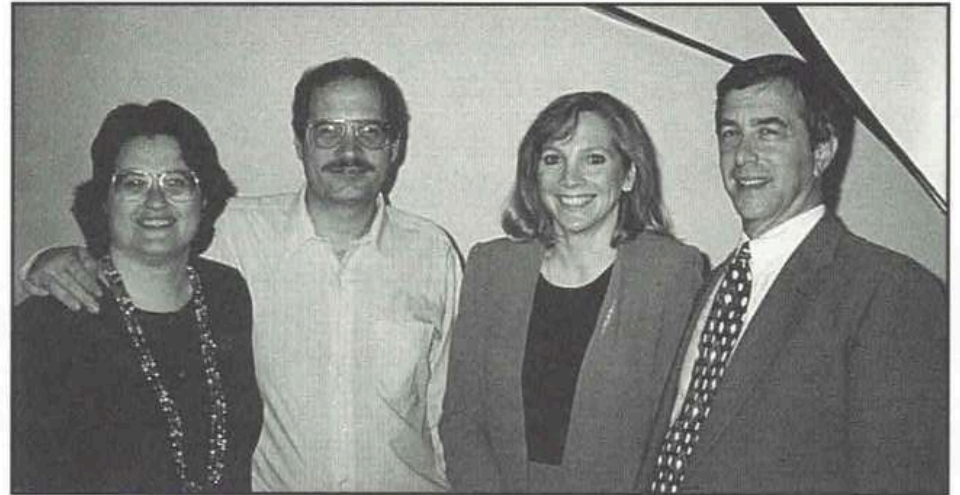
