

Safe Child Update!

Our newest community service program, Safe Child, has gotten off to a great start! The Safe Child Program is a comprehensive prevention of child abuse curriculum for preschool children. The creator of the program, Dr. Sheryl Kraizer, led a teacher training session on November 3. Twenty people participated in the training, including teachers and administrators from the participating preschools, representatives from the Johnson County

Coalition for the Prevention of Child Abuse and NCJW volunteers. Five area Jewish preschools are helping launch the program: Beth Shalom, B'nai Jehudah, Chabad, JCC's Child Development Center and BIAV.

The next steps in the program are the parent information meetings. We will host two parent meetings for all parents at the participating schools. The meetings are

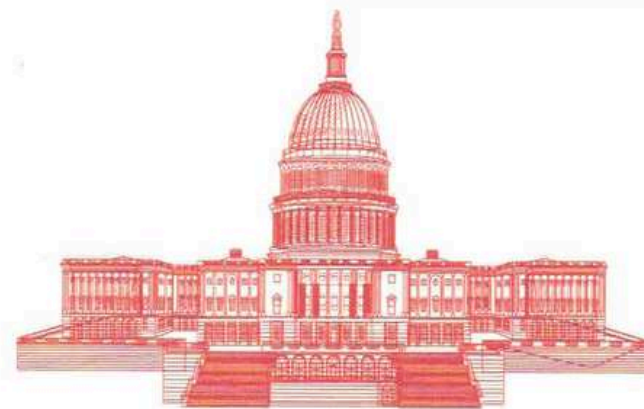

We Donate Unsold Merchandise

The following charitable organizations came to THRIFTIQUE after the sale and selected the type of items that they could distribute directly to those people they serve. Each organization provides service for families and directly relates to the mission of National Council of Jewish Women.

Division of Family Services in Jackson County — we provided wonderful NEW clothing for children in foster homes who may otherwise not have any new garments. We also provided them with Christmas ornaments for the families.

Uplift — we provided this organization with men's NEW sweat pants and tops, jeans and outer jackets. These are distributed by Uplift volunteers to homeless men on the street.

Women's Employment Network — we provided women's suits, shirts, jackets and coats for use when women are interviewing for work and subsequently employed.

Sherwood Center — we provided miscellaneous items. They provide housing and maintenance for autistic children.

Ronald McDonald House — we provided Christmas decorations, stockings and tree ornaments for use in their homes for families of critically ill children.

Don Bosco Centers — we provided children's, women's and men's clothing to be distributed to those people in need who are served at the Centers.

Crosslines — we provided NEW and like-new clothing for men and women, as well as Christmas decorations. These items will be available to hundreds of people who have qualified, based on need, for admittance to a special distribution in December. To maintain the dignity of the recipients, each family is charged \$5.00 and can then choose clothing, household goods, food items, etc. for every family member.
