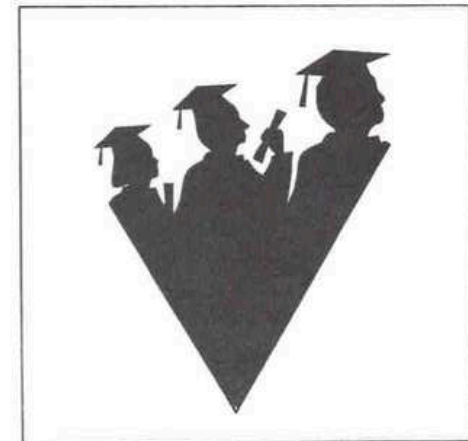

## Scholarships Awarded To 37 Students

This year, NCJW, Greater Kansas City Section, helped make it possible for 37 area students to attend college.

For the 1999-2000 academic year, NCJW awarded nine scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$2,000 to graduating high school seniors and 24 to returning students.

These scholarships are part of a program which has been in existence since 1933 and, since its inception, has bestowed over \$1 million in scholarship funds to high school students regardless of their sex, race or religion. This money comes from generous donations to 14 personal and family scholarship funds.

Recipients are determined on need and merit and must reside in the Kansas City, MO, Center, Shawnee Mission, Blue Valley or Olathe school districts. The scholarships are renewable for those who maintain good grades, demonstrate financial need,

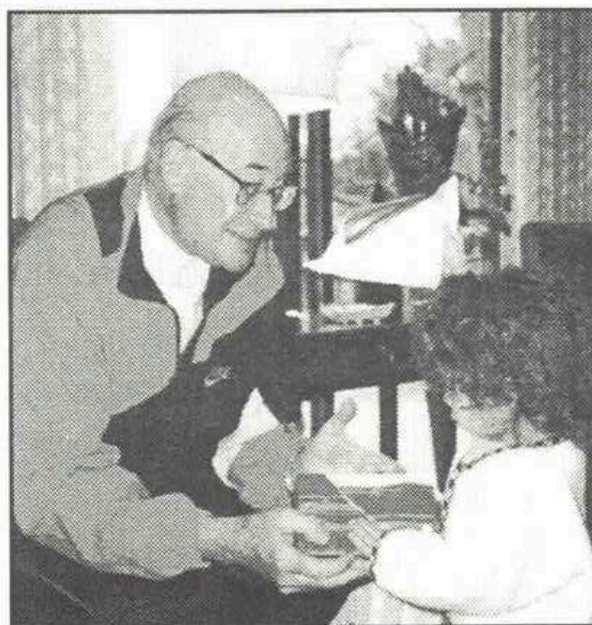
## Dr. Dan Stern ~ Planet Healer

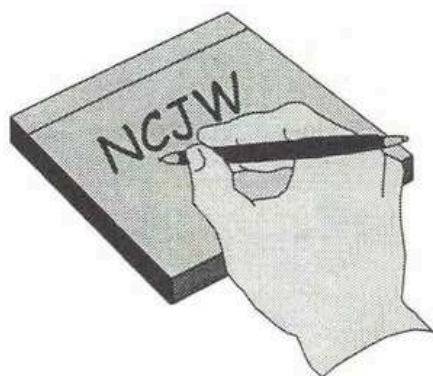

## Dr. Dan Stern Selected as Hannah G. Solomon Award Recipient

will be presented at the Fall membership event.

"Wherever I go, I look at the world as to where we fit in - the effect of the seasons on us...on the birds and the food they eat...on the livelihood of the lawn-care person," reflects Stern who wants us all to care about the environment and to live in harmony with nature.

"CASA has been my main enterprise since 1995," states Stern, who has spent 15 to 20 hours a week on one case alone.

Besides teaching biology and aging for the Department of Continuing Education at UMKC, Stern also served as a frequent guest lecturer at KU Medical Center's graduate course for

doctors, dentists, care managers, and HMO people, sharing his holistic approach to environmental health that includes the well-being of the individual, the family, the nation and the world.

"Everything we do is inter-related, has a far-reaching result. We can effect change," says Stern, professor emeritus of UMKC where he chaired the Department of Biological Sciences. As a member of the faculty for 25 years, he was

also professor of biology and nursing. Moreover, he served as secretary of the Missouri Chapter of the Nature Conservancy in its efforts to restore the Chilton Creek Preserve in the Ozarks to its pine savannah days when Native Americans lived there.

Stern has shared knowledge and disseminated information to the public and the City Council of Kansas City, Missouri by serving on the Education Advisory Committee of the Office of Environmental Management.

All of these achievements with goals reached were not for glory, but for making a difference in someone's life and in the world around us.

## Merle Cole, Section Co-President, Joins 100 Leaders at NCJW Activist Forum

Merle Cole, Co-President of National Council of Jewish Women (NCJW), Greater Kansas City Section, joined 100 national NCJW leaders at the Annual Presidents' and Commissioners' Retreat in Tarrytown, NY, June 25-27, 1999.

The weekend featured strategic planning sessions about state and local advocacy and community action efforts including NCJW's campaign for quality childcare and the StoP program to prevent domestic violence.

The local initiative for StoP includes the Silent Witness Program in collaboration with SAFEHOME and the Kansas Coalition against Sexual and Domestic Violence (KCSVD).

The Presidents' and Commissioners' Retreat provided a forum for NCJW's grassroots leaders to share

information and experiences gained on the front lines and to form a stronger nationwide network of community activists, said Jan Schneiderman, National President.

Merle cited the reopening of *Windows On Day Care*, a 1972 in-depth study of the critical need for quality daycare, as a highlight of the event. This ground-breaking national NCJW study, focused on the lack of services and unhealthy environments found in many daycare facilities. *Windows on Childcare* will be the centerpiece for a nationwide campaign to move childcare to the top of our nation's agenda. After three decades, researchers and NCJW volunteers will check on the progress made in the daycare field, and issue a report this fall.

Currently, the Greater Kansas City

Section is involved in two special projects. The Section, in collaboration with several other Jewish women's organizations, is working on a Women's Health Symposium, scheduled for October 17, 1999 and is open to the entire community.

The second project, made possible through a grant from the Jewish Heritage Foundation, is an initiative to focus on domestic violence within the Jewish Community. Several other Jewish organizations are joining NCJW and SAFEHOME (a women's shelter) in this effort.

Ongoing local NCJW community action projects include *Parties for the Blind*, *Hello, Israel*, and *SafeChild*.

## NCJW Scholarships Continue To Help Recipients

and carry a class load of at least 12 credits.

Over the years, the NCJW Scholarship Program has expanded to include the following:

The **Feld and Bograd Grants** are given to women over 35 who are re-entering the job market and need college financial assistance. Their stories are completely different than the high school aged students who are entering college. These grant recipients are reviewed with entirely different criteria. This year, one Feld Grant and one Bograd Grant were awarded for a total of \$2,000.

The **Jeannette & Jerome Cohen Fund** is awarded to high school graduates entering college. The students have some type of physical disability.

This scholarship was awarded to two students for a total of \$,500.

The **Flarsheim Fellowship** is a \$1,500 grant given to a Jewish woman entering her first year of graduate school. This fellowship was not awarded this year.

The Scholarship Committee met during the spring and summer to interview applicants and award scholarships. This year's committee members are: Rosalyn Jacobson, Chairperson; Jane Duggan; Ellen Portnoy; Sonny Singer; Sally Reicher; and Edith Penzner. New committee members are always welcome.

# Healthy Families Olathe Opens Its Doors!

With much support from the NCJW, Greater Kansas City Section, *Healthy Families Olathe* is up and running, providing free, voluntary home visits to parents and their infants and toddlers living in Olathe.

A program of Kansas Children's Service League, *Healthy Families Olathe* works with newborns whose parents need help in infant and child development skills, locating and accessing health services and who need support in negotiating the joyful, yet sometimes difficult terrain, of the first few years of a baby's life. Through *Healthy Families Olathe*, families can receive up to five years of home visits to ensure that their babies receive the best possible start in life!

A donation by NCJW, through the Emelie Levin Community Service Fund, of \$20,000 over two years was a critical factor in the start-up of the *Healthy Families Olathe* program. Just recently, office space was located at the site of the former Grace United Methodist

Church. An experienced staff comprised of a Family Support Worker, who is trained as a nurse, and an Assessment Coordinator, who has worked with two *Healthy Families* programs previously, were hired to provide these valuable services to the community. A parent education volunteer component is being

developed as well, so families can get together as a group and learn parenting skills and just have a chance to talk and share.

But besides monetary support, NCJW also extended assistance with volunteers who served on the *Healthy Families Olathe* Task Force. These volunteers donated their time, skill and expertise to help shape and develop this important project. This program would not have gotten off the ground without their support. Thank you for all your dedication in making our program become a reality!

*Healthy Families* is a proven program with more than 330 programs in 38 states and Washington D.C. Established in 1983, Kansas Children's Service League is a not-for-profit child welfare agency with offices located throughout Kansas and in Kansas City, Missouri. KCSL continues its mission of keeping children safe, families strong and communities involved with services including adoption, advocacy, Head Start, foster care, family preservation, respite care, teen pregnancy prevention, parent education and youth crisis services.
